If you have been learning at home, please list the things you have done at home. What did home learning involve? What other learning did you do at home (cooking, gardening, Joe Wicks workouts, messaging us through Class Dojo etc). If you have been learning in school, how was learning different in school? Who were you with? How were the routines different? Remember to list as many details as you can and how these things made you feel.</p>	<p>Today you are going to start writing your recount entitled, The Most Unusual School Year Ever! You need to write the first 2 or 3 paragraphs when you discuss everything we did whilst in school before lockdown.</p> <p>Remember your writing targets. Remember to start your sentences in a range of ways and to link ideas in a sentence with a conjunction.</p> <p>When you have finished your paragraphs, remember to re-read them and improve them by editing.</p>	<p>Today you are going to write the middle section of your recount. This is the bit where you really need to grab the reader's attention to the fact that the year changed dramatically.</p> <p>Remember your writing targets. Remember to start your sentences in a range of ways and to link ideas in a sentence with a conjunction.</p> <p>When you have finished your paragraphs, remember to re-read them and improve them by editing.</p>	<p>Today you are going to finish your report by writing about your experiences of learning during lockdown (either in school or at home). Remember to include a concluding paragraph which summarises your year.</p> <p>Remember your writing targets. Remember to start your sentences in a range of ways and to link ideas in a sentence with a conjunction.</p> <p>When you have finished your paragraphs, remember to re-read your whole recount and edit and make improvements. On activity 1 the submarine levels get progressively harder, aim to complete the first two levels. For an extra challenge try the third level.</p>	<p>Short and long multiplication https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zjbyvk7</p> <p>Today you are going to revise the standard method for multiplication.</p> <p>Read through the lesson and watch the video.</p> <p>Complete activity 1 – choose the 2-star or 3-star level.</p> <p>For those of you that have learnt long multiplication and those of you that feel confident to have a go and learn it at home, complete activity 2.</p>	<p>Short division with remainders https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zfdsy9g</p> <p>Today you are going to practise short division. Use the bbc bitesize lesson to revise this if you need to. For many of you, this bbc lesson is too easy and you may wish to go straight to your task!</p> <p>Complete p.43 choosing level A, B, or C to suit you.</p> <p>Many of you know how to present the quotient as a decimal and fraction so do this if you can remember how. Otherwise it is ok to answer with a remainder.</p>	<p>Multiply unit and non-unit fractions by an integer https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/z6ghscw</p> <p>Today you are going to revise multiplying fractions. Think back...do you remember we put the whole number (called an integer) over 1 and then did top x top and bottom x bottom e.g. $3 \times \frac{2}{5} = \frac{3}{1} \times \frac{2}{5} = \frac{6}{5}$ It's as easy as that!</p> <p>Work through the bbc bitesize lesson and watch the video (don't let it confuse you just because they don't put the whole number over 1! It makes no difference because multiplying by 1 doesn't change the number does it!) Then complete activity 2 – the maths whizz worksheet. If you have a family member that can play with you, also play the game in activity 1 for extra practice.</p>	<p>Mental strategies for multiplication and division</p> <p>Today you are going to revise mental calculation methods.</p> <p>Read the examples on p.32 to refresh your knowledge of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Using factors - Partitioning - Multiplying multiples of 10/100 - Multiplying by 19/21 <p>Complete Level A, B or C.
